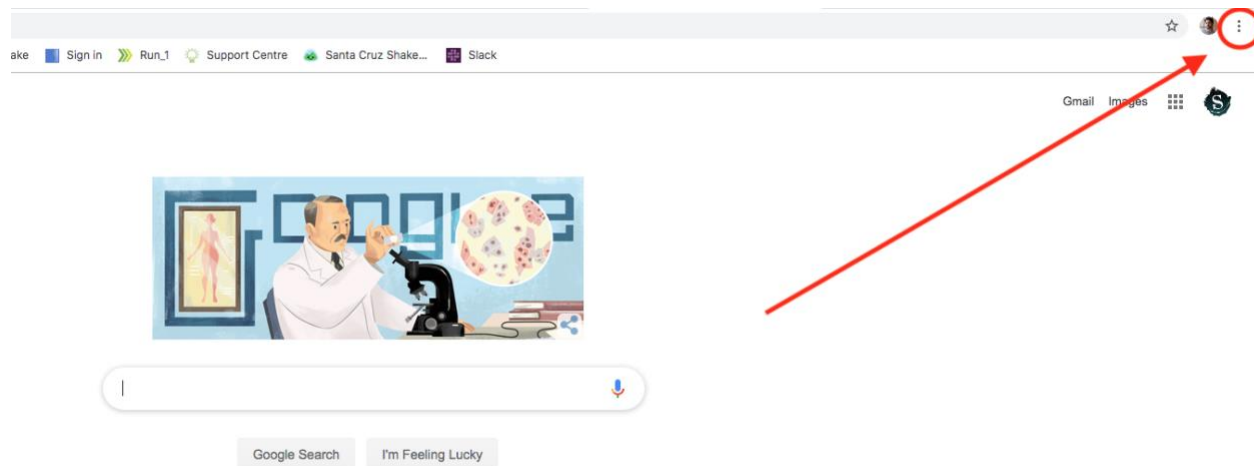
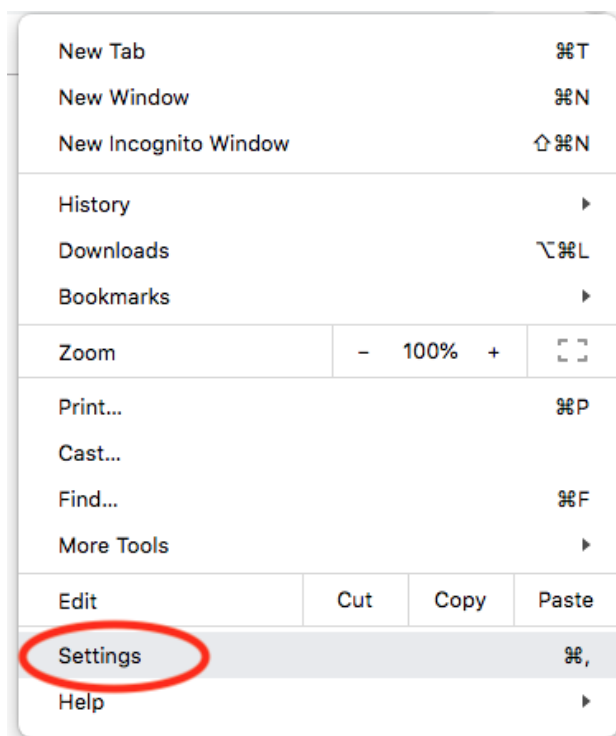


How to enable "third-party" cookies on Google Chrome and Firefox:

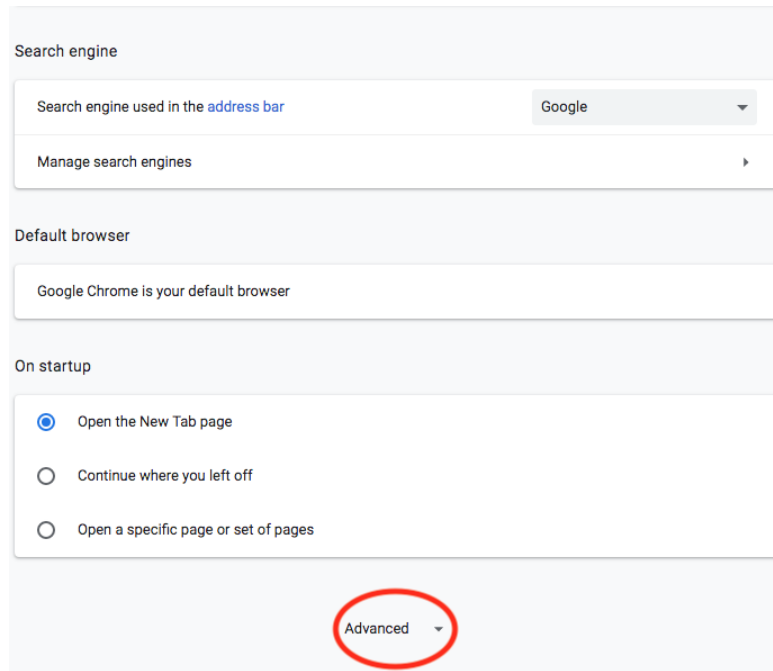
In your Google Chrome Browser, select the "options" button in the top, right corner of your screen.



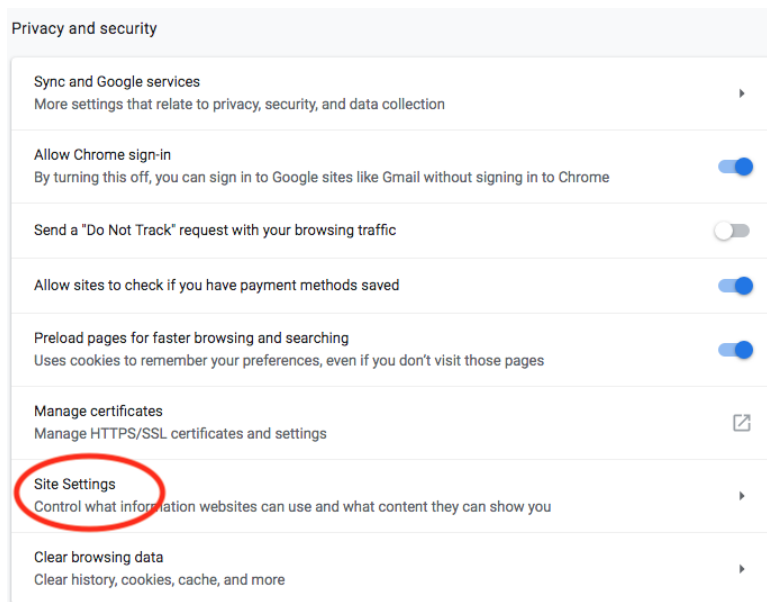
Select the "Settings" Option.



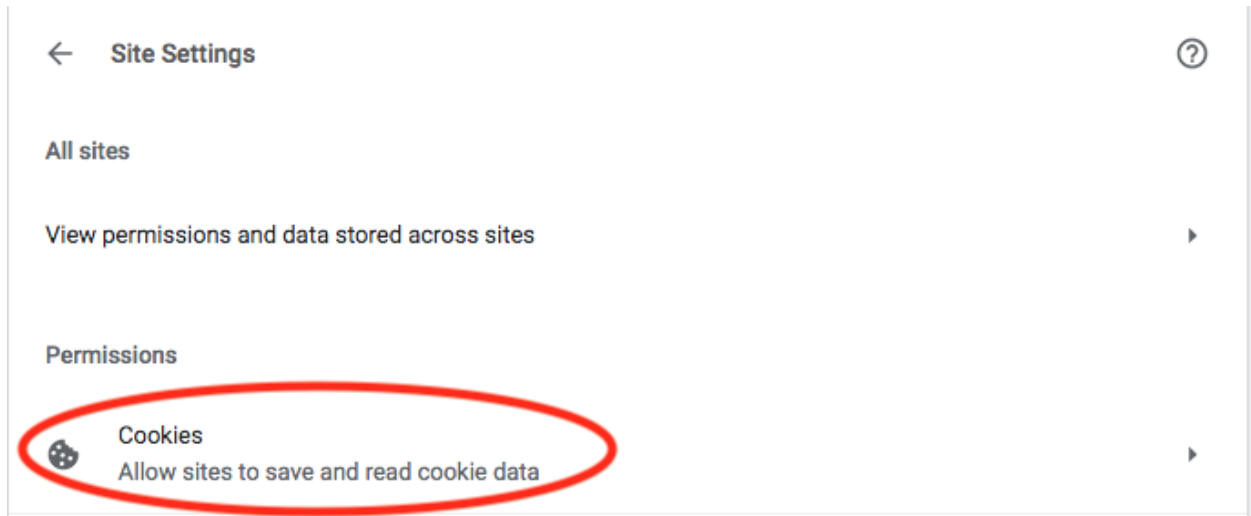
Scroll to the bottom of the Screen and select “Advanced.”



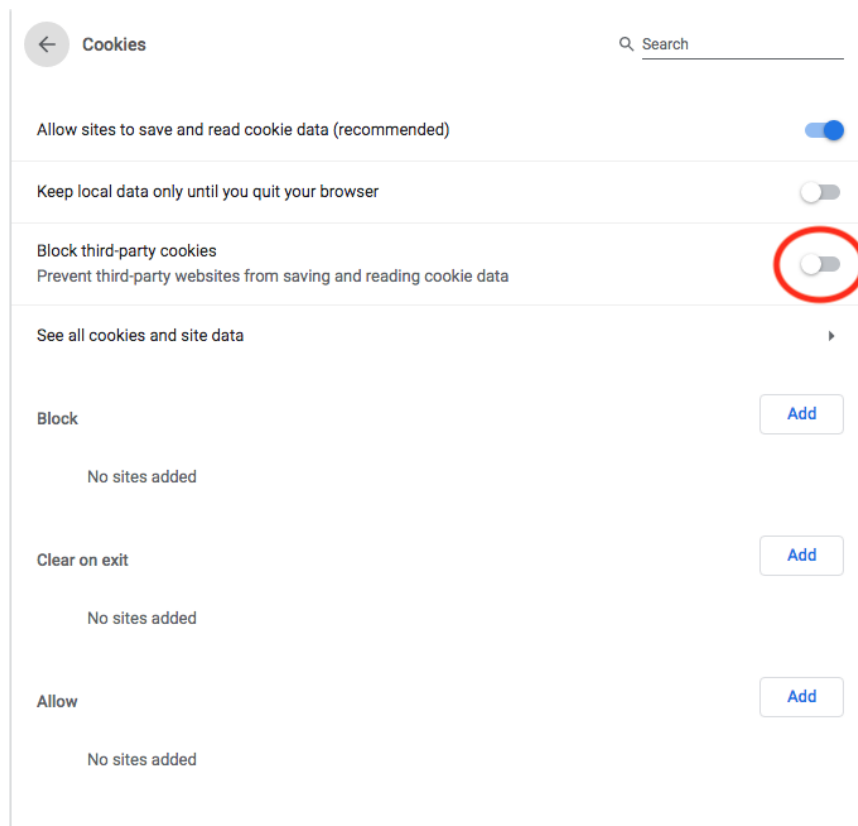
Select “Site Settings.”



Click on “Cookies.”





Enable Third Party Cookies by toggling the “Block third party cookies” function to the off position (Grey).



How do I view or change my cookie settings?

Note: Cookies are enabled by default in Firefox.

Click the menu button  and select **Content Blocking**. The **Privacy & Security** panel of Firefox Preferences will open. This is where you can view your settings for **Content Blocking**, which includes cookies.
